

Remote Design Checklist

To prepare your remote design, please gather as many of the following documents as possible and email them to joel@groundform.studio. The more information you provide, the fewer inconsistencies can arise in your final design.

Site Survey or Plot Plan

A scaled drawing of your property showing boundaries, dimensions, and any existing structures. If you have this from when you purchased your home, that works.

Architectural Plans

Floor plans or elevation drawings of your home or structure. Helps us understand the relationship between the building and the outdoor space.

Existing Landscape Plans

Any previous landscape design documents, even if the design was never built. Shows us what has been considered before.

Photos of the Space

Clear photos of all areas to be designed. Shoot from multiple angles including corners, edges, and any areas with grade changes or existing features.

Property Dimensions

If you know the measurements of your yard or specific zones, include them. Rough estimates are helpful even if not exact.

Inspiration Images

Any photos, screenshots, or references that reflect the style or feel you are going for. Pinterest boards, magazine clippings, or similar projects all work.

The more material you share, the more accurate and detailed your design will be. If you are unsure whether something is useful, include it anyway.
